



Planting introduced in the Recreation Ground

In support of the Council's commitment to the Act to Adapt Plan, we have introduced two new beds within the recreation ground which offer drought resilient planting solutions. Alongside the planting, signage will be applied to allow users of the space to determine species and best planting spaces, as well as explaining the locality elements of the plants chosen, with many being specifically chosen due to being local species.

Councillor Denise Denis said "Following the Council's recent commitment to Act to Adapt and climate response, this planting scheme offers a chance for learning at the same time as offering something visual within the space. It has been a pleasure to work with the Somerset Wildlife Trust and the City Council team to deliver this project".
