# Agenda Item 14 - Connect Centre Report



Eighty vulnerable people were treated to a lively festive lunch at the Connect Centre on Christmas Eve.

Food, soft drinks, Christmas cards and presents were all donated. A team of volunteers did all the cooking, serving and clearing up.

The photo above shows the volunteers who made it happen on the day gathered in the kitchen after the lunch was finished.

Then on Saturday 6<sup>th</sup> January Wells SOUP! returned to a packed Connect Centre with some people having to be turned away as there were no more seats.

The four charities or good causes taking part were the Art Experience Days which stained glass artist Edgar Phillips offers in the Portway Annexe, the six metre diameter Wells in Mosaic which may be going on the Recreation Ground when completed, WCN's Trishaw Project and Wells Air Cadets.

The following week Kean, the Connect Centre's chef, left for another job which may cause problems for the next Wells SOUP! as he used to open the kitchen, heat the two choices of soup which are made at the Blue School, put them in the serving tureens and supervise the washing up done by SOUP! volunteers.

The organisers of SOUP! hope a replacement for the highly respected Kean will be in place before their next event.

Meanwhile the Connect Centre continues with their Breakfast Drop-In on Mondays, Art Therapy Group, Health and Wellbeing sessions, Art Group, Dance Fusion and Friday's Soup Takeaway.
