



Q1 Are you a resident/business of the city or a visitor?




Q2 Before today, were you aware of Wells City Councils plans for the next 4 years?


Q3 Do you feel that the proposed priorities reflect the needs of Wells and its residents and businesses?

Q4 Do you feel that the proposed priorities reflect the needs of visitors to the City?




Q5 How important do you think it is for the Council to strengthen its governance and financial planning?

We have one of the finest, complete gothic precincts in Europe - this shouts of unique. Less tone about maintaining and more about developing, building, creating something special. I would expect my Council to strive for efficient working as a matter of course. This is not visionary stuff. I would like to see stuff about how the Council will take an active lead on bringing partners together - not passing that responsibility to to others such as trade associations. I suspect stronger leadership would be welcomed. The danger of highligting some focus areas such as employment, education and youth provision is that other things are not considered in the priorities. For example, where there is the focus on inclusivity and social integration for significant communities such as gender diverse, elderly and disabled, which groups constitute a very significant part of our city. It reads too much as if we are a a city council for people in employment and education, not a city for all. 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


Q8 Are there any services you feel should be prioritised for protection?


Q9 How tolerant would you be of further Council Tax Precept increases in order to sustain or improve essential services?

Q10 Would you support the Council in generating income through better use of its assets if it helps maintain services and the public estate?



Q11 Would you support the Council in garnering sponsorship for services or assets if it aids in maintaining services and reducing the impact on Council Tax?





So many businesses are not seen, and it is a huge shame that tourists are not aware of what Wells has to offer. 1. The majority of carparks should all be long stay (Tucker Street, Princes Road and Waitrose are currently the only long stay). Tourists get confused with Waitrose Parking, but there is a need for MORE parking, in strategic locations so that people have time to fully explore. 2. Removal of the coach drop off at the top of town, pushing visitors to the bottom of town so they walk up through. 3. Better signage, clear signage that is a heritage style which directs to areas off the beaten path, such as St Cuthberts Church, the bottom of High Street, Mill Street and Queen Street. 4. Create a trail where people can be encouraged to visit low-traffic areas of town. Pavement decals, which are safe and non-slip slip are an effective way of doing this and cost less than £500 (does need planning permission though). These can be created in keeping with a heritage city, and lets face it, given the Covid monstrosities on the pavements for years, there isn't really an effective rebuttal against them! The Visit Wells Facebook page should cover the whole town, it is not good that this is managed by the Cathedral as it does not benefit the whole of Wells and the Cathedral certainly does not support those small independent businesses, yet expects local support! 


Q14 Which of the noted draft priorities is most important to you personally?
